On Tuesday, 14 December 2021, the Museum of Australian Democracy (MoAD) launches its latest exhibition, *Behind the Lines – The Year in Political Cartoons 2021: Prophecy and Chance.*

After 12 months of modelling and predictions, *Behind the Lines 2021* invites visitors to peer into the political crystal ball and reflect on a year that no clairvoyant could have predicted.

From vaccines to submarines, Australia's greatest political cartoonists will offer their unique takes on the unforeseen events of the past year.
